Water Bottles - A Reminder

We would like to take this opportunity to remind parents and carers that only clear, plastic water bottles are permitted in classrooms. There are several important reasons for this:

- Cost and accessibility: Plastic bottles are affordable and readily available to all families.
- **Clarity:** Clear bottles allow staff to ensure that children are drinking water rather than other drinks during the school day.
- **Health and safety:** Plastic bottles are safe to use in classrooms and on tables, unlike metal bottles which can be heavy, potentially hazardous and distracting if dropped or knocked whilst drinking.
- **Consistency and fairness:** Having one clear rule helps ensure equality across the school, avoiding confusion or exceptions.

We do appreciate that some parents have strong views about plastic. As a compromise, children may bring metal water bottles (at their own risk) in their school bags and access them during the day. However, please be clear that from an operational perspective, the school must have a rule that is practical, safe, and suitable for all children and the school cannot operate on the basis of individual preference.

Value of the week - Respect

In our assemblies this week we have discussed the British Value – 'Rule of Law' and why we have laws and how they are different in different parts of the world. We are looking forward to celebrating Black History Month in October.

Online Safety

As infants, we all rely completely on adults to help us resolve situations that are causing us to become upset or stressed. This is known as co-regulation. The next phase, once autonomy has begun to develop, is called self-regulation: this is when children start to become capable of exercising more control over their impulses and behaviour, and managing their own emotions.

This vital developmental milestone, however, isn't reached spontaneously. Learning to self-regulate requires sensitive guidance from trusted adults – simply talking with children about their thoughts and feelings, for instance, can ease the route to self-regulation. This week's guide has some expert tips for supporting children to reach this goal, whether on or off line.


