

Pupil Premium

In 2011-12 the Government launched it's Pupil Premium funding. This money is sent to schools based on the numbers of pupils in the school who are eligible for Free School Meals (FSM). From 2012-13, it has been expanded to include all children who have been eligible for FSM within the last 6 years.

This money is allocated to initiatives to ensure pupils reach their full potential, both academically and socially.

In 2011-12 the school received £2150 in Pupil Premium funding.

This money was used to help provide for the following initiatives:-

Spent on	Aim
Listening Ear	To support pupils' self esteem, attitudes to learning, sense of well-being and enjoyment of school.
One to One Tuition	To help children reach their full potential in Numeracy and Literacy.
Read Write Inc	To ensure all children leave KS1 a reader
1:1 Phonic tutoring	Read Write Inc programme to help achieve their full potential in Literacy

In 2012-13 the school will receive £3692 of Pupil Premium Funding. (This increase is due to the funding now being calculated based on the numbers of children who have been eligible for FSM in the last 6 years.)

If your child does not have Free School Meals, but may be eligible because of your family's income level, please contact the office (in confidence) to register them. Even if you do not wish them to have the meals, this would mean the school could still claim Pupil Premium funding that may be used to help your child.
